

### Say Yes To Breast Feeding Initiative

One of the most important preventive aspects of maternal and child health is breastfeeding. ## IPH Anti-Dengue Day, 15th June 2015

In accordance with the orders of the government of the Puniab, 15th June 2015 was celebrated/ observed as Anti-Dengue Day in all the public sector institutions of Punjab. Institute of Public Health organized a set of activities including a seminar, distribution of health education material, checking/sampling of various indoor and outdoor potential mosquito-breeding sites and a walk to increase the awareness regarding prevention and control of this disease. Students, faculty and support staff of the institute attended the seminar. Talking to the audience Dr. Humanyun Naru (Head of MEP department) said that the larval surveillance for the Aedes Aegypti is helping to shape up the control measures. He also highlighted the importance of routine surveillance activities. Dr. Aslam Anjum (MEP department) shared the information on the development of vaccine against the disease and the results of latest efficacy trials in various countries. Prof. Dr. Maaz Ahmad (Dean), in his closing remarks, emphasized the importance of recognition/ identification of the Aedes larva. He also asked the audience to play their active role in eliminating the potential breeding places and putting every possible effort to prevent the epidemic/outbreak of Dengue Fever. Moreover, a live demonstration regarding identification of Dengue Larvae was given to the participants. In the end, Dr. Shahid Latif thanked the audience and worthy speakers for their valuable time to address the potential disease-risk to our society. Afterwards, an awareness walk was observed from IPH to the neighborhood & pamphlets were distributed among people.
